Probationary Members will pay £5 at each shoot they attend during the Probationary Period, the length of which shall be dependant upon their safety and conduct at Shoots.

Under a Home Office ruling (effective 01/01/1996) prospective members, members and guests must sign a Declaration that they are not prohibited from possessing or using a firearm or ammunition by virtue of Section 21 of the Firearms Act 1968.

Section 21 applies to anybody who has been sentenced to imprisonment or youth custody or detention in a young offender institution for 3 months or more.

The period of prohibition depends upon the length of sentence.

If the sentence was for 3 months or more, but less than 3 years, the prohibition lasts for 5 years from the date of release.

If the sentence was longer than 3 years, the prohibition lasts for life.

It is an offence for any person to transfer, let on hire, give or lend a firearm or ammunition to someone whom he/she knows or has reasonable ground for believing to be prohibited by Section 21.
